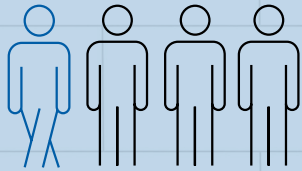

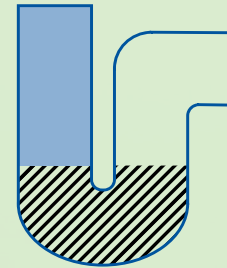
Incontinence is a common
